An introduction to Knight Slights OHR

Knight Slights, now known as Knight Slights Classic, was set to be released for the Spring Collaboration Contest on Slime Salad, consisting of a team of myself, MorpheusKitai and Ichiro. Upon final preparations of the files, Fenrir Lunaris approached me to reskin the game and design a spin-off based on his Cards Against Humanity OHR Deck he had shared with the community on several occasions. At first the production started off as a simple reskin, as planned, but after the introduction of a few gags and the reception on Discord, they quickly got out of control. Fenrir and myself started reconsidering the answer cards that were there to make the deck feel as relevant as it could for the current generation of OHRer, and also to capitalize on the potential for jokes.

In this document, you will see both Fenrir and myself's commentary on the questions and answer cards. The game is intended for the OHR Community but is hopefully enjoyable for people not aware of all the jokes. I was more than happy to code everything that Fenrir wound up drawing. We had a lot of fun brainstorming the individual ideas and figuring out what jokes would make, specifically Idontknow, laugh the absolute hardest.

A special thanks to everybody who contributed to the game besides Fenrir and myself. Several people lent their actual voices to some of the jokes and it helped add variety and flavor to the game.

Because of the nature of the deck, some cards may appear controversial and are not the individual beliefs of Fenrir and myself, but we instead believe they are so outrageous that they deserve to be made fun of.

Thanks for downloading Knight Slights OHR, we both hope that you enjoy it and have a few laughs.

3. Roo: Fen's special joke character he loves to include everywhere.
4. Tim-Tim: Spoonweaver's tiny gnome who might get a second finished game eventually?
5. Louis the Goose: Mr. Triangle's Adventure/Graffiti Goose. Fenrir decided to make him a literal goose and not a cartoon one.
6. Bob the Hamster: Wandering Hamster/Various Others. The decision was made that since Bob was taking the seat of the red knight that he would be the red shades version from Vikings of Midgard.
7. Hati: Hati's Bizarre Adventure/Various Fenrir games. Hati has been Charbile's muse for a very long time.
8. Megaman Sprite Game: a hilarious creation from splendidland, a very promising OHR developer who made her mark on the web with a comic of the same name before making the actual game.

A quote from Kezef in Hati's Bizarre Adventure. The line in particular refers to the husbandry of raising sentient beings for future harvesting - a task that Kezef has apparently been at for millenia.
16. **Hell is a terrible place but this might just be worse _____**
17. **I want to commission Feenicks to draw _____ with really huge boobs**
Feenicks draws harpies. He's also sometimes available for commissions.
18. **I'm _____ and being the cause of other's suffering makes me happy**
A mangled quote by Cthulhu in Spooks and Summons, where he effectively says that he keeps showing up because he's bored and/or a sociopath.

A Swordplay quote.

A quote by Hati in Spooks and Summons, after being confronted for the mess she left in the bathroom.

27. Let's not go to ____ it is a silly place.

Camelot, in Monty Python's Holy Grail. Could also apply to the Slime Salad Discord channel itself.

28. Oh right sort of forgot that ____ used to be a man.

A reference to a line in Hati's Bizarre Adventure. The main antagonist Gahn appears as a woman in this title, having previously been depicted as a man.

29. OHR House 4 broke all expectations with ____'s nude shower scene

Nude shower scenes are remarkably common in OHR games. Also, there is no OHR House 4.

30. On their next adventure ____ saves the world in their birthday suit.

Technically this could apply to any number of OHR games, but it's specifically a reference to the War on Christmas game, where Freki from Vikings decides to "bare all" on a drunken dare.

31. Real men wear ____ as hats

Olaf from Vikings of Midgard starts off with a sword in his head equipment slot.

32. RMZ's next game stars Mr Triangle's adventures in ____

For a period of time, Mr. Triangle seemed to have a spin-off almost as often as Mario, but significantly less complete or memorable.

Artimus Bena always tries to organize some type of birthday event for TMC, which he always refuses. This year Rue wanted to get him a goat, which seemed to get the best reaction from the community. We have no idea what TMC wants, or how to get him a gift.

The joke is usually "Mac Support", but in truth, we have no idea when the next major engine update will come out or what will be in it.

Pinecones? Spoonweaver is notorious for his mystery boxes and sends things that can usually go straight from box to trash. Every once in a while there's one item in the box that could actually be kept. Because of this people tend to muscle through them. Spoonweaver gets deep satisfaction out of people's reactions to the boxes. If he sends you one, humor him and do an unboxing video.

Idontknow hosted the Ridiculous Games Contest one year, and this was a highly anticipated entry for it. We can only assume the answer was "For the furry waifus", but we may never know.

54. You people who can't see the signs don't be surprised when ____ spins from control

Another excerpt from a Swordplay post.

55. You will be soooo ashamed when ____ breaks your game in such obvious ways

Foxley helped playtest Vikings of Midgard and discovered many unusual and otherwise undocumented bugs. This quote came out shortly after that. It can also apply to when Rue played Axe Cop, a game also seemingly ready for release and found pages of issues to be fixed. Playtesting a game is super important and people like Foxley and Rue are beyond value for their ability to spot issues.

A reference to a HOTOHR 2010 game, wherein the boat to leave the overworld area cost so much that it was a challenge to afford it.
2. **A budget of over \$5000 USD.**
Fyrewulff contacted Fenrir about doing a lot of art assets for a Steam release of Sword of Jade. This was Fenrir's quoted commission price. We'll get back to you if it ever happens. In the context of the game, when this card is played Bob the Hamster gets in a scuffle with his rival that Fenrir and I refuse to let fade away into obscurity, Vlad the Impaler/Hamster. The two hamster switch places and trigger different responses.
3. **A dinner with a wolfgirl.**
4. **A fat panther in a tuxedo.**
A reference to Sneak Feast.
5. **A generic OHR protagonist.**
It's heavily implied that most OHR developers start out making the same type of character in their early works, a generic carbon copy of Cloud from Final Fantasy 7. Playing the card causes the most famous one, of Fenrir's design, Kyle, to ride through the pub on a motorcycle.
6. **A Gizmog story.**
7. **A glorious sunfish.**
The Sunfish itself is a tongue-in-cheek reference to Surlaw, but the fish itself actually appears in Vikings of Midgard. The fish will try to pathfind itself to the player, and has the habit of blocking the way, thus causing a bit of grief in Speedruns of the game.
8. **A harpy's birdnest.**
9. **A jacked dude in a hamster suit.**
When explaining the difference between furries and funny animals, this is commonly brought up in terms of the sliding scale of anthropomorphism.
10. **A magical girl transformation.**
Specifically the Sailor Moon transformation, but OHR games have a habit of having one of their characters undergo a magical metamorphosis of sorts.



11. **A puppy adventure.**
The game Puppy Adventure, by Fenrir-Lunaris. A seemingly innocent game, which... come on, you know who it's by.
12. **A roadtrip adventure with MILFs.**
A reference to the in-development game Broadtrip, which is about two mothers going on a cross-country roadtrip.
13. **A strange man in a field peeing.**
14. **A Swordplay Monologue.**
There are many. And they are all unintentionally funny. Sometimes he gets drunk and they become funnier.
15. **An entertaining Artimus Bena stream.**
There are many. And they are all unintentionally funny. Sometimes he gets drunk and they become funnier.
16. **An OHR Veteran.**
17. **Arc Wars.**
18. **Artimus Bena.**
A famous OHR musician, noteworthy for composing the soundtrack to Vikings of Midgard.
19. **Awakening the Pillarmen.**
Ay yi YI YI

Answer Cards

20. Surfasaurus

A game by Red Triangle Games, and winner of the 2016 Heart of the OHR contest. It was a controversial win because of what the community defined as an actual RPG at the time. In the context of the game, only the Harpy reacts to the prescence of Surfasaurus, primarily because Feenick's game was the one to go head to head with it in that contest.

21. BANANA!

22. Barnabus.

A mysterious OHR celebrity who released ~30 unique games for one of the Terrible Games Contest. One for each day. The identity of Barnabus has yet to be uncovered, though many people have suspicions.

23. Bean boy.

Bean boy is a game where you play as a lovecraftian monster that runs around town absorbing people. It's essentially the blob from the movie of the same name.

24. Bees?

RMZ has a love/hate relationship with bees, after having to code so many in Axe Cop. Ravancloak tends to try to murder RMZ in multiplayer games with bees everytime they play together.

25. Being attacked by a giant shrimp.

A reference to a boss fight in Broadtrip, which itself is referring to the Cup Noodle sidequest in Final Fantasy XV.



26. Between Hati's Thighs.

Charbile's favorite place to curl up and take a nap.

27. BILLLIY AHDVENTUER!!!11!

An adventure where you hold right, from My Little Gahn. Also referenced in the sequel, No More Villains.

28. Billy from Arfenhouse.

He's on some sort of adventure.

29. Bird's Windows 95 computer.

The joke is that the OHR user known as Bird tested out Vikings of Midgard on a much older machine than expected.

30. Bob the Hamster's kickass shades.

Fenrir-Lunaris tends to draw the OHR's mascot with a pair of stylized shades that look like something from Gurren Lagan.

31. Bob the Hamster.

The first hero of the OHRPGCE, star of Wandering Hamster, and defacto mascot of the community.

32. Bob's nonexistent thumbs.

We're wondering how he holds things, given his sprites and official artwork usually depicts him with stumps.

33. Body destroying anal sex.

Reference to a Ronintendo rant/speech. Your guess is as good as mine why Katja freaks out about it. It's because in Discord when somebody brings up anal sex, Katja's creator, kylekrack tends to freak out about the subject in general, even when it's non-descriptive.

34. Cameo appearances people won't get.

And there are MANY.

35. Castle Paradox.

An OHR website predating Slime Salad. Hosts an extensive gamelist, but has a history of downtimes. Current inhabitants include various colorful rodents and stoats.

36. Charbile's magical world.

Answer Cards

37. Charbile.

Artist and OHRPGCE game developer, known for his work on Sword of Jade, Sleepover, and Hati's Bizarre Adventure.

38. CHUFFY.BAM.

An old song from the earliest days of the OHRPGCE that seemed to show up in almost every game for mysterious reasons.

39. Darkmoor Dungeon.

A game by Mooglee1, one of the most downloaded games on Slime Salad.
Popular in Brazil.

40. Dating a sprite edit.

41. Deleting your listed games.

Many OHR users seem to do this at some point, thus complicating the point of a historical “all OHR games” gamelist. Not all games should be remembered for more than being a stepping stone for a developer to make something memorable.

42. Diana Moon.

Wolf mother from You Need a Hero, Necromancer Ate My Cat, Broadtrip, and Hati's Bizarre Adventure.

43. Diana's Pizza Shop.

Diana shows up to deliver “delicious pizza” in Hati’s Bizarre Adventure. If the heroes can’t pay, they may have to shoot a lewd video.

44. Diana's watermelon panties.

An in-joke with Idontknow, in that Diana has watermelon themed furnature and appliances, that her underwear is probably also likewise themed.

45. Dog-girl feet.

We still don't know how they fit so neatly into shoes.

46. Dogero shrugged, by Ayn Rand.

An in-joke to how the original dialogue in *Sword of Jade* seemed like it was written by Ayn Rand.

47. Dogero.

Hero and main protagonist of Sword of Jade.

48. Eating soap.

A reference to Don't Eat Soap, a game by James Paige. The card triggers Bob to burp out a bubble, using the same sound effects that were in the game. When Bob is swapped out for Vlad, Vlad laughs at the absurdity of the concept.

49. Enormous dog boobs.

Reference to basically any one of Fenrir-Lunaris's games.

50. Eyepatch lingerie.

51. Fat frogs.

A reference to an OLD OHR game, that was apparently sold through AOL messageboards.

52. Feenicks.

OHR game developer and artist known for his drawings of harpies and other mythical monstergirls.

53. Fennecs.

A game by Idontknow involving fennecs. Alternatively, a species of small fox.

54. FENNECWAVE AESTHETIC.

[illegible]

55. Fenrir-Lunaris.

OHR game developer and artist known for their more-than-PG drawings of wolf-girls.

56. Festivus.

An OHR game by Feenicks. Also a famous Seinfeld holiday.

57. Flanat Village.

The starting town in Wandering Hamster.

58. Foxley.

59. Freki's soft, plush firecrotch.

So fluffy.

Answer Cards

60. **Fyrewulff denying being a furry.**

Fyrewulff is the programmer/writer/developer for Sword of Jade. A game with only one human character (okay maybe two). And every time he denies being a furry, it gets funnier each time.

61. **Getting to Slime Salad's front page.**

A tremendous accomplishment for any OHR game developer to see bestowed on their game. Or you could just ask Spoonweaver if you need help.

62. **Goldenchan.**

An upcoming game by Spoonweaver, about the hero Golden Chan who wants to compete in the competitive game Swordz. In all honesty, in writing this in mid 2021, whoever is the least successful on Steam between Charbile and Spoonweaver has to make Goldenchan. The community has faith Charbile will win, so we believe Spoonweaver will make this title.

70. **Housemaster.**

A zany (zany is an understatement) character from the hit web movie, Arfenhouse.

71. **In the alley behind this bar.**

72. **Insufficient playtesting.**

A requirement for most OHRRPGCE games.

73. **Is that just a goose or what?**

74. **JO'Z H33R.**

Reference to the Arfenhouse movies, where GOOD KITTY crashes through a window. Repeatedly.



75. **Karrible.**

The best OHRRPGCE game ever made. For streaming. Released for one of the Terrible Games Contests.

76. **Katja's Abyss.**

A game by Kylekrack, that is often compared to Minesweeper.

77. **Katja's bathwater.**

A reference to "Gamer Girl Bathwater".

78. Knives taped on hamsters.

The ultimate fighting machine.

79. Low quality vore porn.

See also: A Mircea Kitsune game.

80. Mac Support

A meme about “what feature needs to be worked on next”.

81. Magical bullshit shenanigans.

82. Masturbating in the NSFG chat.

83. Megaman Sprite Game.

A famous OHRPGCE game that got popular in Twitch plays.

84. Mi’La with a pegging harness.

Because you’ve been a bad puppy, haven’t you.

85. Mircea Kitsune.

An OHR game developer who uploads porn games to Slime Salad using unlicensed edits from Fenrir-Lunaris’s work.

86. Mr. Triangle’s Maze.

An unfinished game by Red Triangle Games.



87. Mr. Triangle’s shapely butt.

A game by Ronintendo.

97. One of Ronintendo’s many fursonas.

Ronintendo has the habit of changing his online persona so often that we can’t keep track of who or what he’s decided to go by now, but by and large they are all usually colorful rodents of some kind.

We needed a card for Pri, and hilariously, the screenshots for this game appear to be where we got Swordplay's classic avatar which is used in the game.

105. Punching your stepdad in the balls.

106. Putting weird fetishes in a game.

107. Questionably lesbian witches.

Reference to witch.rpg, a game by Feenicks, whose protagonists fit this description.

108. Ravancloak.

Everyone pronounces her name wrong most likely, as we tend to say it like it's a bird. We gave her avatar in the game a literal cloak of Ravan's, making her look like Odin's birds from Vikings of Midgard.

109. Ronin Catholicism.
